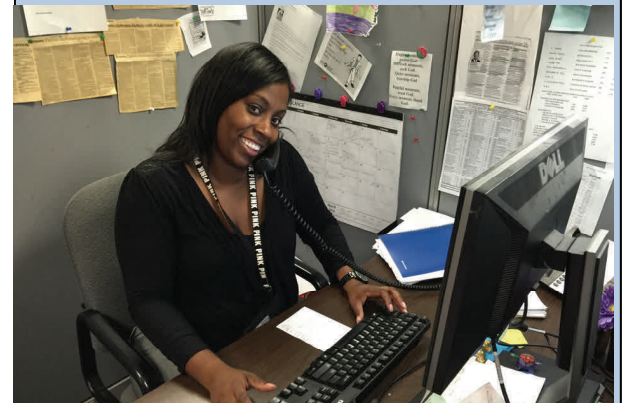

What kind of jobs do we offer?

Caseworker

A Caseworker is responsible for assessing the social service needs of individuals and families within the community. The caseworker position requires a Master Degree in Behavioral Science or a BS in Behavioral Science and 36 months of relevant experience.

Social Welfare Examiner

Social Welfare Examiners will handle initial intake and determination of eligibility and assistance for individuals for various social services programs. This position requires an associate's degree or a high school diploma and 24 months of relevant experience.

Qualifications:

Associates Degree

OR

High School Diploma and two years of experience examining, investigating or evaluating claims for assistance, or working with clients in a social services, human services, or community organization setting, or in screening or interviewing individuals for the purpose of gaining specific factual information;

Probation Officer

Probation Officers play a significant role in both the criminal and juvenile justice systems. This position requires a MSW or a BS in Social Work with 24 months relevant experience.

Qualifications:

Masters Degree

OR

Bachelors Degree & two years of experience counseling or casework

Public Safety Dispatcher

Public Safety Dispatchers operate high-tech communication systems utilizing radio, telephone and computer equipment to receive 9-1-1 emergency and routine calls requesting police, fire, or EMS services. This position requires a high school diploma

Corrections Officer

A Corrections Officer for the County Sheriff's Department involves responsibility on an assigned shift for the enforcement of rules and regulations governing security, conduct, discipline, safety and general well-being of inmates of the County correction facility.
